HISTORY

BRIDGE IN COLUMBUS DEFORE ORGANIZATION OF THE CENTRAL OHIO BRIDGE ASSOCIATION

Such bridge promoters as A. Elliott Kimberly, M. Porter Walley and Louis McLean were the organizers of bridge games and events as

early as 1932.

On January 19, 1932, Mr. Kimberly founded the Columbus Contract Club, a duplicate club for men only. This was the first organized duplicate club in Columbus. Kim was the President for nine consecutive years. He was also a member and promoter of the Inter-club Team-of-Four which ran for several years.

Not to be outdone by the men, the women organized the Women's Contract Club with Mrs. A.B. (Mary Jo) Miller as director. This was the forerunner of the present Women's Duplicate Bridge Club. first game was played October 18, 1932. The games were played at the same time and location as those of the Columbus Contract Club.

Also in 1932, M. Porter Walley, who was a genius for duplicate

organization, started games at the Neil House. There were

eighteen teams in the Industrial League.

From the bridge article in the Columbus Sunday Dispatch under date of November 27, 1932, by M. Porter Walley: "The newly organized Capital City Tournament will hold its first annual meeting at the Deshler-Wallick Hotel on the afternoon and evening of January 14, 1933."

Open Pair - The Morrey Jewelry Trophy Team-of-Four - The Dr. Louis Mark Trophy

In 1933, at the personal invitation of Mr. Wallick, a studio was opened in the Deshler-Wallick Hotel. Mrs. Edmund B. (Eloise) Neil and M. Porter Walley were the managers and Mr. Kimberly was the Treasurer. Mrs. Neil conducted classes in duplicate bridge and regular duplicate games were scheduled at the studio. On February 20, 1936, The Franklin Bridge Club was formed.

In September, 1936, mostly through the efforts and generosity of L.C. Wallick, Crockfords Club was formed, with games each Friday evening at the Deshler-Wallick Hotel. Trent Sines was the manager and Robert G. Reed the director.

On December 30, 1937, The Deschapelles Club was organized with L. Sterling Wylie as director. Games were scheduled each

Monday evening.

To create interest bridge games were conducted under various headings, such as: Republicans vs Democrats; Big Leagues - Cards, Yanks, Giants, cubs; "Pony" games; Inter-club League - Faculty, Contract "A", Engineers, Army, Contract "B", University.
events were: Team-of-Four, Men vs Jomen, Individuals, Industrial League games. Also, there were matches with Dayton, Springfield, Chillicothe, Lancaster and Piqua.

ORGANIZATION OF THE CENTRAL OHIO BRIDGE ASSOCIATION

1938

From the bridge articles in the Columbus Sunday Dispatch by Louis McLean, writing under the name of William Lewis.

February 6, 1938.

" A meeting of the organization committee for the Columbus Unit of the American Contract Bridge League has been called for Monday, February 7, 1938, at 6 o'clock. The meeting will be for a winner at the Athletic Club with Dr. Louis Mark acting as host. T.B. (Shady)
Devine heads the following committee as chairman: Dr. George M. Boling, Col. H.S. Brown, Mrs. C.F. Frosh, Mrs. Cecile Guthrie, A.E. Kimberly, Louis McLean, Dr. Louis Mark, Mrs. Addison B. Miller, John Newton, R.G. Reed, Trent Sines, Mrs. Joseph Viau, Ralph Walters and Mrs. Harry W. Watson."

February 20, 1938.

"With a temporary organization formed, work is going forward to perfect a Columbus Unit of the American Contract Bridge League, with all elements of the Columbus bridge world represented. The following group of temporary officers were chosen: T.B. Devine, Chairman; John Newton, Secretary; A.E. Kimberly, Treasurer. These officers have been chosen by the committee to serve only until a sufficient number of members have joined so that an open election may be held."

March 6, 1938.

" The active organization of the local unit of the American Contract Bridge League is being held up by only one thing - lack of numbers. One hundred members are required before a charter can be issued by the national body, and only 75 have actually joined."

March 27, 1938.

" Over one hundred people have now joined the local unit and within the next few weeks they will each be notified of the next meeting."

April 17, 1938.

Heading of the bridge article: "Columbus Bridge Club(COBA) holds initial meeting; officers named."

The Clintonville, Central and East End Clubs were started. Regarding the Clintonville Club, which was started December 15, 1939, Mary Jo Miller wrote the following in the January 7, 1940 issue of the Columbus Citizen: "The founding of the Clintonville Bridge Club can be traced directly to the enthusiasm of Mr. and Mrs. John Potts. Their goal was to form a non-profit club composed of congenial residents of the northern part of Columbus and any others who might care to join. John is particularly interested in bringing new faces and new names into the 'winners' circle', and in encouraging the player whose percentage is apt to be below .500. In other words, he is desirous of promoting bridge for ALL players."

" The Potts went about it in a most intelligent manner. First, they wished to locate a director who really understood the problems of the new club, and who, at the same time would be sympathetic with their purpose. It seems only natural to this reporter that they eventually settled upon Mrs. George Adams as their choice. She is very capable as a director of duplicate play and this department congratulates Mr. and Mrs. Potts upon being able to secure Mary as director of their games. Enthusiasm far exceeded everyone's expectations. By their second meeting they had over one hundred members."

The Master Point Boards were acquired by the COBA. The purpose of the boards was to show the total number of master points each member of the COBA had won. Bob Louis, President of the COBA at the time the boards were made, appointed Pat Lehman as custodian of the boards. They were on display for the first time during the All-American Regional. Pat Lehman took care of the boards until his resignation as Secretary of the COBA, October 9, 1959. Following his resignation Carl Shere, Mary Chubb, Marj Poole qnd others attempted to keep them up to date. At its meeting January 7, 1967, the Board decided to discontinue use of the boards.

The Board, at its meeting on July 8, 1952, voted to change the

Fall Festival from a two day to a three day tournament.

In 1934 Mrs. George P. (Cecile) Guthrie, paired with Morie Elis, won the President's Cup Pair at the Summer National held at Asbury Park, New Jersey.

G. Eloise Neil was a member of the Women's Team-of-Four which won the Coffin Trophy at the Spring National held in New Orleans in 1950. In 1955 her Team was second; thirdin 1956.

Mrs. W.H. Lehman and Mrs. Joseph F. McCarthy won the Second Flight of the Masters' Pairs at the Summer National held in Columbus, July 29-August 6, 1950. They were the first winners of the Levintritt Trophy.

In the same National, Sol Babich and Laura Hardy won the President's Cup Pairs and thus were winners of the Morgan Howard

Trophy.

Paul E. Gable, Sr., Franz Westreich, Stanley Schwartz, Jr. and Dr. Milton Levitin won the Rothschild Trophy by winning the Sub-Seniors Masters' Team-of-Four at the Summer National held in Cincinnati in 1952.

Dr. J.F. Alexander was a member of the Men's Team-of-Four which won at the Fall National held in Miami Beach, November 23-December 1, 1963.

John R. Biddle and James P. Wisemiller won the Silidor Trophy by winning the Open Pair at the Spring National held in Cleveland, March 12-21, 1965. Wisemiller, at the age of 21, was the youngest player ever to win the Open Pair at the National.

Norman Fischer placed second in the Life Masters Men's Pairs at the Fall National held in Miami Beach, November 21-30, 1969.

SCHACKNE MR. AND MRS. BRIDGE CHAMPIONSHIP TROPHY

BRIDGE COLUMNISTS

M. Porter Walley.

In addition to being a genius at organizing bridge games and events Mr. Walley wrote the bridge articles for the Columbus Sunday Dispatch for a number of years. He was associated with Eloise Neil in the operation of the Columbus Bridge Studio. When Mr. Walley left Columbus to organize bridge in Cincinnati, Cleveland and Indianapolis, Eloise took over the writing of the bridge articles.

Louis McLean (writing under the name of William Lawis).

After Eloise had written the bridge column for the Columbus Sunday Dispatch for a time Louis McLean took over the assignment. His bridge column was headed 'The Sighs of Bridge'. Later Mr. McLean moved to Dayton.

G. Eloise Neil.

Eloise followed M. Porter Walley as editor of the Columbus Sunday Dispatch bridge column. Then Louis McLean wrote the article for a time. Starting with the issue of Sunday, September 10, 1939, Eloise has been writing the bridge articles without a break. She is also the reporter from District 11 for the Midwest Monitor. Through the years Eloise has conducted many classes covering all aspects of the game of bridge. At one time she was the only Culbertson Master Teacher in Columbus. Eloise has been a powerful influence in the development of bridge in the Midwest Conference as well as in Columbus and the COBA.

Mrs. George P. (Cecile) Guthrie.

When Ely Culbertson came to Columbus to give a lecture on contract bridge at Lazarus, September 22, 1938, the one who was his escort was Cecile Guthrie.

Immediately after Mr. Culbertson's visit Cecile wrote a series of six articles which appeared in the Columbus Citizen. Following this series she began writing the bridge articles for the Ohio State Journal. These appeared each Monday, Wednesday and Friday. She has been the only columnist whose articles have appeared more than weekly.

Mrs. Addison B. (Mary Jo) Miller.

When the Columbus Citizen began printing a Sunday Edition on November 6, 1938, they persuaded Mary Jo to write the weekly bridge article. She continued writing the column until she moved away from Columbus in 1942. Mary Jo was also the organizer of the annual Columbus Citizen Men versus Women Tournament.

Mrs. Harry T. (Mary) Flasher.

During 1940-1942 Mary wrote weekly bridge articles for the Clintonville Booster. When Mary Jo Miller left Columbus in 1942, Mary took over the writing of the bridge column for the Sunday Edition of the Columbus Citizen. She continued writing for the Citizen until 1952.

Mrs. Earl (Irene) Hickman.

Irene wrote bridge articles for the Clintonville Booster. During the ACBL Summer National held in Columbus, July 29-August 6, 1950, she wrote some articles for the Ohio State Journal. She also wrote articles during some of the Regional Tournaments held in Columbus.

The history of the COBA has been one of steady growth. In 1967-68 the paid up membership had grown to a total of 1217 -631 from Greater Columbus and 586 from Out of Town Member Clubs. This included 85 Life Masters.

The raising of membership dues by the ACBL caused a slight drop in the total membership of the COBA but it is gradually

building up again.

During the early years of the COBA Dr. Mark would make up the deficit incurred financially at tournaments. However, for many years now, the financial condition has been very sound.

David Bruce, 2/ Oswald Jacoby, 3. Howard Schenken, 4. Waldemar von Zedtwitz, 5. Hal Sims, 6. B. Jay Becker, 7. T.A. Leightner, 8. Richard L. Frey, 9. M.T. Gottlieb, 10. Sam Fry, Jr., ll. M.D. Maier."

From the bridge article in the Columbus Sunday Dispatch under date of January 16, 1938, by William Lewis: "The three great national bridge organizations have been merged into one great body for several months now. The name of the new organization is: The American Contract Bridge League. Its first National Tournament, held in Washington a few weeks ago, was wonderfullu successful."

From the bridge article in the Columbus Sunday Dispatch under date of March 20, 1938, by William Lewis: "The American Contract Bridge League came out this week with a complete list of bridge players all over the United States who hold master points. Among the local players Dr. Louis Mark stands head and shoulders above the rest of the group with 28; Cecile Guthrie, Stanley Schwartz and Edward Ackland, 8; Trent Sines and Daniel Webber, Jr., 4; T.B. Devine and W.A. Klunk, 3; H.W. Carter, Louis McLean, Ben Melancon and M.E. Moore have one each."

From the bridge article in the Columbus Citizen under date of October 29, 1938, by Cecile Guthrie: "M. Porter Walley, who now has two successful bridge clubs in Cincinnati and Cleveland, will be the official scorer under Tournament Director, George W. Beynon, New York, at the important Central Ohio Bridge Championships, November 11,12,13, 1938, at the Deshler-Wallick Hotel." (This was the first COBA Sectional Tournament).

From the bridge article in the Columbus Citizen under date of "There are now 37 units of the March 26, 1939, by Mary Jo Miller:

American Contract Bridge League."

From the bridge article in the Columbus Citizen under date of October 26, 1941, by Mary Jo Miller: "According to the records of the American Contract Bridge League there are now five National Masters(10 master points) in Columbus. They are: Dr. Louis Mark, Mrs. G. Eloise Neil, Mrs. Cecile Guthrie, Mrs. W.H. Lehman and Syl Rothschild."
